

Town of Milladore April 3, 2022 Meeting MINUTES

The April 3 Town of Milladore Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Connie Milz with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Additions to the agenda included Clerk requests.

The March 6 secretary report was read, Leon moved to approve with corrections, Hank seconded, motion carried.

Treasurer's report was shared Hank moved to approve, Leon seconded, motion carried.

Old Business

Reviewed updates to five-year plan. Moved hiring a surveyor back to year 2023.

Hank shared information on Green for Life (GLF) Solid Waste/Recycling Handler. GLF costs \$62 a ton for solid waste and \$48 a ton for recycling removal. Difficult to compare because Advanced Disposal charges by the dumpster. Recycling costs more than solid waste for disposal.

The Department of Revenue (DOR) manages all assessments classified as manufacturing. It takes a few years for DOR to take over a parcel or get out of a manufacturing classification. It becomes assessed differently when the state notifies the assessor of change in property status. Need to wait and see if the plant is sold and/or new owner starts the plant back up.

New Business

Leon moved to approve the Responsible Bidder Ordinance #3, Hank seconded, motion carried.

Hank moved to approve the Ethics Ordinance (Ordinance #5), Leon seconded, motion carried.

Leon moved to approve Ordinance 4 Relating to Confidentiality of Income and Expenses Provided to Assessor for Assessment Purposes, Hank seconded, motion carried.

Position descriptions for Chair, Supervisors, Clerk and Treasurer were reviewed and will be posted to the Town of Milladore Website.

Standing Agenda Items

Bids were received from Red Rock Granite and JJ Brush Cutting, bids will be coming from Becker Trucking and Waushara County Hwy. Dept. Weed Brush Inhibitor Spray. The bids are for 5000 yards of gravel + or – to be delivered anywhere in the Town of Milladore; for 3000 yards + or – of Road base to be delivered anywhere in the Town of Milladore; for Calcium Chloride with Beet Juice for Dust control along with Bids for Brush cutting with one pass in June with three or more passes where needed in the fall. Bids will be opened at the May 1 Town of Supervisors meeting.

Waiting for SMA from State before bids are placed for road work on Blueberry Road, which received LRIP funding.

Discussed Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Law bill which is Federal Money that can be used to repair bridges and new black top projects. Noted Trestik Bridge needs to be replaced will be entered under the Road Repair Program because the bridge is

too short for the Bridge Aid program. Requirement of engineer still applies for second round of funding that could cover up to 80% of the cost of bridge repair project, if selected.

Discussed challenges of grading roads in spring. Unable to grade roads until frost is totally out of the ground. If your gravel road has standing water means frost is still in the ground.

Additions to agenda, Clerk shared the following mail received:

- The heat will remain on in the Town Hall for Election on April 5
- Noted that we will begin to tape over audio taped meetings after the Annual Meeting minutes have been approved from April of 2021.

Leon noted that Town of Milladore received 8 ton of Food Grade Salt from DeBoer trucking. Used Pat Altmann's loader and trailer to move salt to Town Hall roughly four hours of labor.

Hank moved to pay bills, Leon seconded, motion carried.

Leon moved to adjourn meeting, Hank seconded, motion carried.

Next meeting is set for May 1 at 6:30pm.
